# **International Sport Management**

24-25 and 27-28 July 2017 09.30h-13.30h

## Course Description

This course will provide students with an understanding of international sport management through examination of the preeminent global sports body, the International Olympic Committee (IOC). In addition to studying the IOC's governance functions and the organization's relationships with constituent organs – National Olympic Committees (NOC), International Sport Federations (IF), Organizing Committees for the Olympic Games (OCOG) – special attention will be paid to the process that determines how cities are selected for the honor of hosting the Olympic Games and Olympic Winter Games in alternating even-numbered years. Students will study in real time the bids of the three cities – Budapest, Los Angeles, and Paris – that are the finalists to host the 2024 Olympic Games, with the decision to be taken 13 September 2017 at the 130<sup>th</sup> IOC Session in Lima, Peru.

## Course Objectives

Students of international sport must obtain an awareness and understanding of this significant global institution – the IOC – that organizes two multi-sport, multi-day competitions of the world's best athletes, and that seeks inclusion of participants from virtually every country on the planet. Upon completion of this course, students will have acquired substantial knowledge about the IOC, its origins, mission, and how it has evolved to become a social force for positive change through the inherent power of sport. As a consequence, students will be more conversant about the challenges facing managers of international sport organizations. This version of the course will consist of an examination of three cities' – Budapest, Los Angeles, and Paris – live bids to host the Games of the XXXIII Olympiad.

# Course Method

Lecture and discussion facilitation by instructor, with expectation of active student engagement based on assigned readings. Upon course conclusion, students will perform a simulation in which they play the role as delegates for one of the three candidate cities – Budapest, Los Angeles, or Paris – and present summary arguments to the class.
